Construction, Maintenance and Allied Workers Canada (CMAW Canada) has dedicated an Annual Bursary Program to honour the memory of Dave Flynn. The bursaries of \$500.00 each will be awarded to six successful candidates each year (one for each district area). The Education Committee will choose one applicant with the best essay who will receive \$1,000.00.

ELIGIBILITY:

Any member or an immediate family member of any CMAW Local who is taking post secondary education or training may apply. (Includes: spouses, children, grandchildren). Applicants can be enrolled in an academic institution, commercial, technical, vocational or art programs.

Applicants must submit a 500 to 1,000 word essay which focuses on some aspect of trade unionism: history, politics, economics, social reform or a personal history of a trade unionist. The essay should be in proper essay style and include references and bibliographies. (Not included in final word count). An impartial jury will select the winning essay.
